

#### CAPTIAL READ PROGRAM: LET'S TALK: DEALING HONESTLY WITH RACISM

A major theme of Nothing More Dangerous is racism and what it means to be prejudiced. Author Allen Eskens started the book in 1991 as a way to examine his own feelings about the prevalence of "subconscious racism," the quiet racism that comes out in sentences that begin, "I'm not prejudiced, it's just that..."

In this program, Dr. Darius Watson and Delora Scaggs will engage in a conversation about what it means to be prejudiced and asking "the right questions" of ourselves-even when they're tough. Both are educational leaders: Watson is a political scientist and interim dean of admissions and enrollment at Lincoln University and author of numerous articles in political and popular publications. Scaggs has served for 23 years in the Jefferson City Public Schools, in the classroom, as a behavior interventionist, as assistant principal at Lewis and Clark Middle School, and now as the new principal of Thorpe Gordon Elementary School.



#### CAPTIAL READ PROGRAM: WHAT PARENTS & TEACHERS NEED TO KNOW ABOUT EXTREMISM AND THE RADICALIZATION OF YOUTH

"It's almost human nature to divide folks into us and them," explains Hoke Gardner to his teenaged neighbor Boady Sanden in Nothing More Dangerous. But what happens when the natural human tendency to divide is exploited by adults looking to recruit and radicalize our youth during an era of converging social crises? These issues heighten the risk of division and increase the risk of societal violence.

Dr. Avila Hendricks, professor of education at Lincoln University, will use Nothing More Dangerous to point out the vulnerabilities that make some youth more susceptible to hate group rhetoric or recruitment. Her presentation will conclude with practical advice to parents and teachers on how to talk to children and teens about acts of violence and the issues of radicalization and extremism.

In 1991, he began writing Nothing More Dangerous as a way to explore his feelings about prejudice and racism, working sporadically on the story during the intervening years. He published the book--his sixth--last year to high praise from both national and local publications. Nothing More Dangerous is different from his previous works; it's a story set in the Missouri Ozarks in the 1970s with a focus on family, loyalty, friendship, and simmering racial tension. Reviewers have called the book 'a stunning small-town mystery" (New York Times Book Review) and "a coming-of-age book to rival some of the best..." (Library Journal, starred review). A mid-Missouri native, Eskens is a retired criminal defense lawyer who lives in Minnesota, After his presentation, Eskens will sign books and meet with local fans and appreciative readers.
