


PASSIONS OF PAINTING

August - October MRRL Art Gallery



Rural landscape settings and reflective Americana is apparent in many of Larry's paintings. He often paints of days gone by in a setting of rustic rural architecture or of flora and fauna capturing mood and color in a narrative scene. His love of the outdoors shows up in many of his landscapes where the skies often take center stage.

He has been juried for five years into Watercolor USA along with the Missouri Watercolor National 2010 and 2014 while becoming a signature member in 2014. He has received multiple awards in in regional art competitions, and his work is displayed in galleries throughout mid-Missouri as well as in Springfield and Branson.
