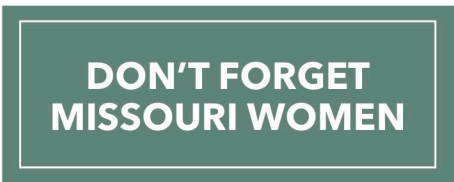

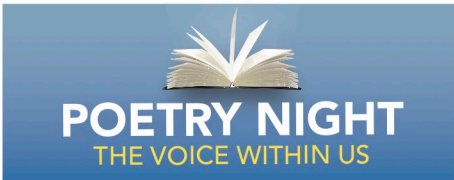

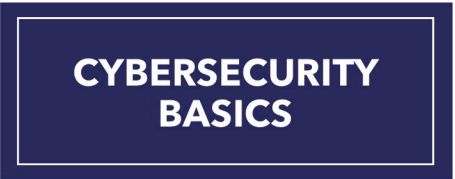

AN ORPHAN TRAIN STORY:
THE MYSTERY OF JOSEPH ANER MARKWAY

In 2017, Greg Markway, Joseph's grandson, went looking for the answers. With the use of modern DNA testing, as well as genealogical records, Greg found Joseph's parents—and lots more. In this presentation, Greg talks about the need to know where we come from and the surprises we find along the way.
