OLYMPIA PART 1: FESTIVAL OF THE NATIONS

Leni Riefenstahl directed and produced a two-part documentary of the 1936 Olympics, commissioned by Hitler. Considered one of the best sports films ever made as well as one of the best propaganda films, "Olympia" introduced film techniques still used today. The film premiered in 1938 for Hitler's 49th birthday. Riefenstahl's sophisticated film techniques changed the way sport was shown on screen. Festival of the Nations celebrates the human body in movement and includes Jesse Owen's celebrated races.

WHY THE OLYMPICS WERE SO **IMPORTANT TO THE NAZIS:** FASCISM, DIPLOMACY, AND **GERMANY'S ROLE IN INTERWAR** EUROPE

PLAYING LIKE A GIRL: TITLE IX AND EQUALITY FOR ATHLETES

Title IX legislation, passed as part of the 1972 Education Amendments, helps protect against gender-based discrimination in educational programming that receives financial assistance. Although Title IX protects against discrimination in many different venues, it is often closely associated with athletics. Dr. Ahoo Tabatabai, will explore the important ways in which Title IX changed the athletic landscape for women and girls, while also focusing on the work that remains in ensuring that athletes are treated fairly regardless of gender.
