RACS: A SAFE PLACE WHEN IT ISN'T SAFE AT HOME

LU-MRRL LECTURE SERIES: LIGHT AND SCIENCE FICTION: WHAT WE CAN AND CAN'T DO WITH **LASERS**

THURSDAY, MARCH 18 | 7:00-8:30p.m. | Virtual Program While light was harnessed in the form of lasers in the 1960s, scientists have been racing to catch up with science fiction for the past 60 years. Popular franchises such as Star Wars and Star Trek depict lasers with devastating properties, but in most cases these lasers are complete works of fiction. Dr. Tim Quincy, assistant professor of chemistry, will examine why some of these systems are not possible with our current scientific understanding. He will also look at some of the commercial uses of light and lasers that are inspired by science fiction and are common today.

AUTHOR TALK: EXTRAORDINARY BLACK MISSOURIANS

Now in its second edition, Extraordinary Black Missourians profiles more than 100 notable citizens, such as Grace Bumbry, George Washington Carver, Elizabeth Keckley, Frankie Freeman, Scott Joplin, Jean Baptiste Point du Sable, James Beckwourth, and others who have contributed to Missouri's African American legacy. They set records; made discoveries; received local, national, and international acclaim and awards; and led the civil rights movement by breaking down racial barriers. These accomplishments have played a major role in shaping the history and culture of the state and nation. Co-authors Dr. John A. Wright, Sr., Sylvia A. Wright, and John A. Wright, Jr. bring decades of experience writing about their native St. Louis and the heritage of African Americans in their hometown. They are the recipients of numerous awards for their civic and educational work and leadership.

AUTHOR TALK: THE 1849 CHOLERA OUTBREAK IN JEFFERSON CITY

Did you ever consider writing about a historic event, whether fiction or nonfiction, but felt you didn't have the ability to do so or that you had no idea where to start? Join this program and learn about a new book, The 1849 Cholera Outbreak in Jefferson City, and its origin. You will learn not only about the story line but also explore how it came together, including some of the resources used in the research and writing process. The presenter will be Gary Elliott, a music educator by training who works as a professional land surveyor. He has published two previous books: The History of the Jefferson City and Cole County Councils of the Boy Scouts of America, 1910-1929 and They Came and They Went: A Brief History of the B'nai Sholem Cemetery (Along With Those Interred There).
